In August, Lorna Noack will pass on to Jimmy Clark the challenges of leading Houston Bronze Ensemble into another chapter. At the first planning meeting for that new board she read a quote by Max

Depree, "The question is 'Who do we **intend** to be?' not 'What are we going to do?'." As we went through that first meeting, the word EXCELLENCE drove us as we dreamed and planned. She kept that word in our sites for all the years she served as president. That intent has helped us to move toward excellence. One of our goals was to take handbells into the Houston community and beyond. Lorna is a teacher and she led us to make education a focus of the ensemble. We also worked with several schools taking a workshop to Slocum ISD and playing for students from kindergarten to high school. For many of them this was a first time to see bells and we gave most of the students the opportunity to play them as well. We served as a mentor to two high schools, inviting them to share the concert stage with us for our spring concert. We also began what has become a long lasting relationship with the Brookwood Community, serving as a mentor to their bell choir. Until Covid, we were there each week for a rehearsal and can't wait to get back to our friends at Brookwood. They also shared the stage with us at two of our spring concerts and we played the National Anthem together at an Astros game. Houston Bronze wishes to thank Lorna for all she did to help us move toward what we intend to be, excellent. Perhaps one can never truly achieve excellence for there is always more to be done. The 2020-2021 ringing year is complete, and it sure was a crazy one! This time last year we were starting to think about how Houston Bronze Ensemble could return to ringing in the fall. The best case scenario was that we would be able to have at least one Christmas concert. The worst case scenario was not being able to have a concert, but at least have a few weeks making music together again as an ensemble. Luckily we were able to have one live Christmas concert and record another version for our YouTube channel. This past spring we continued the COVID safety precautions we implemented in the fall: ringers did not change positions or share bells, and one ringer to a table. We performed one live concert which will be on our YouTube channel soon. For now you can view it on the Trinity Klein YouTube channel. Planning for the next ringing year will start soon. Bill Nave, our artistic director, is starting to finalize the upcoming Christmas program. We will welcome two new ringers to the ensemble, and look forward to ringing at some of our favorite locations in December. Our Celebration Ringers small ensemble will be available to help your club, community group, or family ring in the Christmas season. As a full ensemble we will return to ringing like we did before the pandemic. We will dust off our Petit and Fritsen bells, silver melody bells, and some of the heavy metal our audiences have come to expect during our concerts. ## Planning Meeting for 2021-2022

The incoming Houston Bronze Board held their first meeting to begin planning our new ringing season. We talked about the ifs, ands, buts, and the who, what, where, how and when of the new season. We are excited to get back to ringing in a more normal way. New concert dates were confirmed and we will be ready to begin in August. We are excited that we can begin to offer once again Build a Bell Workshop and hopefully will be able add some of those gigs we looked forward to each year.









When I joined HBE in January of 2016 I had only seen Malmark bass Choirchimes played in concert. No bell choir or group I rang with owned bass chimes. How excited I was to learn I was assigned to ring them in several pieces we were playing that season. After receiving a how-to from Ben on striking and damping I jumped right in. What a rude awakening I had when I realized they're not as easy to play as it looks. That striking and damping thing can be like rubbing your belly and patting your head until you get the hang of it. And reading those lower ledger lines ... thank you, Jerry,

for helping me find my notes! I quickly fell in love with playing the bass chimes, happy to see my name next to the bass chimes when we got our assignments at the beginning of each new bell season.

HBE made the decision to get back to ringing during the COVID pandemic. The Board established stringent protocols and ringers were given the option to ring or not. We rang the fall using just the specific bells and chimes assigned to us. For the spring season we had picked up an additional ringer so were able to add the bass chimes to the mix. Since we were still not changing bell positions and ringing only the bells assigned, Bill asked if I would play the bass chimes. Of course, I said yes!


One of the protocols established to allow us to come together to was keeping to the recommended 6 feet distance apart. Instead of two ringers to a table each ringer had a full table to themselves. Because of this we had to move to a larger rehearsal space. In our regular rehearsal room the bass chimes don't have much of an impact because the sound really has nowhere to go. What a wonderful surprise it was to find we could actually hear ... and feel ... the resonance of the chimes during rehearsals.

The bass Choirchimes added so much to each of the pieces we rang this past spring, especially since we weren't ringing the lowest bass bells except in a few instances. My favorite piece was Sandra Eithun's arrangement of "What a Wonderful World". One could close their eyes and picture the string bass being plucked or imagine the sound of the bass trombone. I played baritone saxophone in high school concert and jazz band. I've always greatly appreciated the sustaining deep tones and weightiness of bass instruments. I guess that's where my love for the Malmark bass Choirchimes comes from.

I was asked if I wanted to continue ringing just the bass chimes for our upcoming fall season. I hesitated before answering. As much as I loved my season on the bass chimes, I have really missed having bells in hand. I want to play the bass chimes as often as assigned, but my greatest love will always be handbells. How lucky I am to get to ring in an ensemble that provides the opportunity to do both!

### About the Houston Bronze Ensemble

The Houston Bronze Ensemble is a professional, auditioned, handbell ensemble made up of musicians from the greater Houston area. Known as Houston's premier handbell choir, the ensemble performs regular concerts in the winter and spring as well as at community events, regional and national handbell events, weddings, and private parties. In 2014 HBE had the honor of performing with the Houston Symphony. The group plays a wide variety of musical genres, always with the goal of EXCELLENCE.

Founded in 1988, Houston Bronze Ensemble was started as an avenue for Houston area handbell directors to have a place to ring. A lunchtime meeting with Jeff Weiss, Christine Anderson and Hart Morris in attendance and with only a napkin to write the names of those who might be interested is what started it all. The rest, as they say, is history. In the fall of 1988, Hart Morris became the first director of Houston Bronze. After Hart moved to Tennessee, the ensemble rang under the direction of Margaret R. Tucker. In the 1995 season, the group rang ensemble style with various ringers, including G.W. Shepherd, Andrew Bowen, and David VanderMeer, directing the ensemble. Conductors since then have included David VanderMeer, Dolan Bayless, Ben Harris, Ruth Seiwell and James Roberts. Bill Nave was appointed the artistic director in August, 2014.

Houston Bronze recognizes the importance of investing in the future of handbell ringing. We offer a variety of educational opportunities designed to meet the unique needs of churches and schools who wish to build or improve their handbell program. Workshops designed to meet the specific needs of a choir, mini concerts, and petting zoos are a sample of what we provide to the Houston area handbell community. Houston Bronze also offers scholarships to students wishing to attend College Ring-In, an event sponsored by Handbell Musicians of America.
