### **A Concert of Pearls**

Oysters, pearls......and HBE?? Seems like an unlikely combination! As we prepare to celebrate our 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary, it's been interesting to discover more about pearls (the traditional 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary gift), the oysters in which they de-

velop, and the wonderful way they depict Houston Bronze's story.

Pearls were chosen as the material to represent the 30<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary because they are enduring and last under pressure. Throughout our 30-year history, HBE has been faced with trials that could easily have caused the group to disband. Just one year after the group's formation, the artistic director, Hart Morris, moved away from Houston. Thankfully, our founding members didn't let this deter them. They made the choice to recruit another director (Maggi Tucker) and continue to enjoy ringing together. Now working under our eighth different artistic director, we are grateful that throughout all the changes in leadership, the group has not only endured under pressure, but also continued to grow and thrive.

Thanks to oysters, pearls exist. Interestingly, it is an intruder like a grain of sand or particle of food trapped inside the oyster's shell that begins the formation of a pearl. In order to protect its soft, delicate body, the oyster covers the irritant with layers of nacre - commonly referred to as mother-of-pearl. After several years of build-up of this protective layer, a beautiful pearl is produced. The older the pearl, the larger, more beautiful, and more valuable it becomes. Likewise, the intrusion of irritants has plagued HBE throughout the years. Directors and ringers moving on and leaving the group short-handed, issues with equipment, losing a rehearsal space, lost or forgotten music, and scheduling conflicts are just a few of the irritants that have been encountered. While working through the issues is often painful, looking back we can now see these irritants have resulted in a group that today is strong, vibrant, and truly a thing of beauty. We hope, that just like pearls, we will become more beautiful and valuable as we age.

We hope that you are making plans to join us at one of our concerts this spring as we celebrate our 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We'll be sharing some of our most beautiful pearls of music from throughout our history as well as premiering new pieces that are sure to delight. Having endured and lasted under pressure, Houston Bronze is excited to share our "A Concert of Pearls" as we remember our past and look forward to our future as we change the way Houston (and beyond) thinks about handbells.

# Houston Bronze 30th Anniversary Original Composition Contest

The Houston Bronze Ensemble, is happy to announce the winners of our 30th Anniversary Original Composition Contests. The ensemble met on December 4 to read through the entries in the contest. We received 14 compositions. After reading through the compositions, the entire ensemble voted for the winning compositions. In a very close competition, first place was awarded to "Trinity", composed by Caleb Onstead. The second place award was given to Rob Riker for "Tapestry". Work on these two excellent compositions has already begun. They will both be performed at our 30th Anniversary Dinner/Concert on May 18, 2019 and then again on Sunday, May 19, at Trinity Klein Lutheran Church.



# MEET CALEB ONSTEAD "Trinity"

Currently 18 years old, Caleb's handbell experience started in 2006 when he participated in

handchime and handbell programs at his local church at the time. By 2013, he had attended his first Handbell Musicians of America Festival Conference and attained membership in every handbell program offered at his church (including the adult ensembles). Since then, he has become a regular attendee of the local North Hills

Handbell Festival in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, as well as Bay View Week of Handbells in Petoskey, Michigan; an event geared towards individual ringers and led by Fred Gramann. He has also rung with Grove City, PA Celebration Ringers and Ring Pittsburgh of Allison Park, PA.

Caleb's interest in composing began in 2014 with the purchase of Finale software. By Summer of 2015 his first piece, "Fanfare and Variation in C", was completed and accepted for publication. The piece is under contract with From the Top Publishing and is expected to be in print soon. Also published is "Triumphant Spirit" which is available from Sonology Music as of winter 2017. That piece was completed in the summer of 2016 and was premiered by The Celebration Ringers on December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2016.

Other notable premieres of advanced compositions include the premiere of "Lydia's Song" by LA Bronze on April 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2018. Another work was also premiered in 2018. "Toccata Festivo" was premiered by the Stow Heritage Ringers of Stow, Ohio at Caleb's high school graduation recital. This was a special premiere; one that honored Caleb's close relationship with SHR.

Besides working with handbells, Caleb is also an advancing pianist. When not composing, he is working towards ARCT diplomas in Piano Performance and Pedagogy from the Royal Conservatory in Toronto. He also enjoys the non-musical pastimes of reading, fishing, and watching movies.

Caleb and his cat, Allegro, reside in Berlin Pennsylvania.





# MEET ROB RIKER Tapestry

Rob Riker graduated from Bucknell University with a BA in Music and followed that a few years later with a Master's Degree in Education from the

same institution. While at Bucknell, he sana with the Rooke Chapel Choir, the Concert Chorale, and rang with the Rooke Chapel Ringers, all under the direction of Dr. William Payn. Since that time, he has been the Director of Music at Moravian Academy Upper School, where he conducts three handbell choirs, two vocal choirs, and the a cappella group Coda Red. He also teaches music theory and composition and is the Chair the Fine and Performing Arts Department. In his "free time" he is the technical director and manager of the Dyer Auditorium at Moravian, where he creates and teaches lighting and sound design and helps with all aspects of technical theatre. He composes and arranges music for vocal ensembles as well as for handbells and boomwhackers at Moravian. This year he has taken the reins as the director of the Rooke Chapel Ringers at Bucknell University, where he follows in the footsteps of his longtime mentor Dr. Payn. He lives in South Whitehall, PA, with his wife Laura, his son Jonathan (now a student at Bucknell himself), daughter Alison, and his pup Ruby. He is happy to report that everyone in the family rings bells (even Ruby, who has to in order to go outside!).

He also directs a children's bell choir and 'Jubilation' at Atonement Lutheran in Fargo, ND. Jeremy was the first HBE scholarship recipient to take advantage of having one of his pieces read during the unpublished reading session. ### In Jeremy's words:

My experience at the college ring-in was more than I was expecting it to be. I was able to meet so many new people and connect with the handbell community. At first, I was unsure about what it would be like to play with a new group. But whenever uncertainty came, it was matched with the grace of my peers and being welcomed into a community of wonderful musicians and people.

The ring-in gave me a look into the possibilities I

could pursue within the handbell world. I have been composing and arranging for a few years now, but I never imagined the possibility of following that passion beyond just doing it for fun. Having one of my pieces played in the unpublished reading session helped me see that people (especially college students) enjoy my style of music making and that gives me fuel to keep diaging deeper into composition to see what comes out the other side. Whether it becomes a career or just a few pieces here and there, I know that things I (and everyone who choose to create art) have value despite their experience or lack there of. Likewise, I loved seeing the other students bring their pieces and enjoying their creations from the performance perspective. Performing something unique and never before read is a cool feeling and a great experience.

Lastly, this ring-in helped me on my journey to become a better music educator. Carolynne Mathis was my handbell director in church from 4th to 12th grade. I was lucky to have a great teacher from the beginning and to have good practices instilled in my habits. Playing under Carolynne's direction again after a few years studying education has connected the dots from theory to practice. I am looking forward to bringing all I've learned back to Moorhead (MN) with me to share with my bell choirs and help form wonderful musicians and people. (continued on next page)






### Jeremy Mattson College Ring-In Scholarship Winner continued

I believe that being a handbell player by definition makes one a better team player, more confident in their independence, and helps us overcome the fear of asking for help. It takes a crowd to play 7 octaves of bells.

### About the Houston Bronze Ensemble

The Houston Bronze Ensemble is a professional, auditioned, handbell ensemble made up of musicians from the greater Houston area. Known as Houston's premier handbell choir, the ensemble performs regular concerts in the winter and spring as well as at community events, regional and national handbell events, weddings, and private parties. In 2014 HBE had the honor of performing with the Houston Symphony. The group plays a wide variety of musical genres, always with the goal of EXCELLENCE.

Founded in 1988, Houston Bronze Ensemble was started as an avenue for Houston area handbell directors to have a place to ring. A lunchtime meeting with Jeff Weiss, Christine Anderson and Hart Morris in attendance and with only a napkin to write the names of those who might be interested is what started it all. The rest, as they say, is history. In the fall of 1988, Hart Morris became the first director of Houston Bronze. After Hart moved to Tennessee. the ensemble rang under the direction of Margaret R. Tucker. In the 1995 season, the group rang ensemble style with various ringers, including G.W. Shepherd. Andrew Bowen, and David VanderMeer, directing the ensemble. Conductors since then have included David VanderMeer, Dolan Bayless, Ben Harris, Ruth Seiwell and James Roberts. Bill Nave was appointed the artistic director in August, 2014.

Houston Bronze recognizes the importance of investing in the future of handbell ringing. We offer a variety of educational opportunities designed to meet the unique needs of churches and schools who wish to build or improve their handbell program. Workshops designed to meet the specific needs of a choir, mini concerts, and petting zoos are a sample of what we provide to the Houston area handbell community. Houston Bronze also offers scholarships to students wishing to attend College Ring-In, an event sponsored by Handbell Musicians of America.
